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
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

It has taken on an aura of authority because it is easy to understand, but it is only a myth, and not a requirement of the law. Gerry W. Berren, JU, LL.M., 350 Gerry W. Beyr joined the faculty of the Texas Tech University School of Law in June 2005 as the first holder of the Governor Preston E. Smith Regents Professorship. Previously, Beyer taught at St. Mary's University and has served as a visiting professor at several other law schools including Boston College, The Ohio State University, Southern Methodist University, the University of New Mexico, Santa Clara University, and La Trobe University (Australia). He is the recipient of dozens of outstanding and distinguished faculty awards including the Chancellor's Distinguished Teaching Award, the most prestigious university-wide teaching award at Texas Tech. He was also the recipient of the 2012-2013 Outstanding Researcher Award from the Texas Tech School of Law. As a state and nationally recognized expert in estate planning, Beyer is a highly sought after lecturer. He presents dozens of continuing legal education presentations each year for many state and local bar associations, universities, and civic groups. He is the editor of the most popular estate planning blawg in the nation which for the past four years has been named to the ABA Journal's Blawg 100. He has authored and co-authored numerous books and articles focusing on various aspects of estate planning, including a two volume treatise on Texas wills law, an estate planning casebook, and the Wills, Trusts, and Estates volume of the Examples & Explanations series. He has three times won awards from the American Bar Association's *Probate & Property* magazine for his writing and is one of the most often downloaded law authors on the Social Science Research Network. He is currently the editor-in-chief of the *REPTL Reporter*, the official journal of the real estate, probate and trust law section of the State Bar of Texas. Beyer serves as a mentor to many students and various law school organizations as well participating regularly in pro bono activities. He is the advisor for the Estate Planning and Community Property Law Journal and its annual seminar. Beyer received his JD from The Ohio State University and his LL.M. and JSD degrees from the University of Illinois. He is a member of the Order of the Coif, an academic fellow of ACTEC, and a member of the American Law Institute.

Jonathan G. Blattmachr is a principal in Pioneer Wealth Partners, LLC, an independent wealth management firm that offers a comprehensive suite of advisory services to high-net-worth clients and families. He has over 35 years of experience in trust and estate law and is a retired member of Milbank Tweed Hadley & McCloy and the Alaska, California, and New York Bars. Blattmachr is recognized as one of the country's most creative trust and estate lawyers and writes and lectures extensively; he has authored or co-authored six books and over 500 articles on estate planning topics. He has served as a lecturer-in-law of the Columbia University School of Law and as an estate planning upies. He has served as a recturer-in-raw of the committee interesting school of Law and as an adjunct professor of law at New York University, Law School in its masters in tax program. He is also a former chairperson of the trusts & estates law section of the New York State Bar Association, has served on several committees of the American Bar Association, is a fellow and a former regent of ACTEC and past chair of its estate and gift tax committee, has served as an advisor on The American Law Institute, Restatement of the Law, Trusts 3rd, as a fellow and director of The New York Bar Foundation, and is a fellow of the American Bar Foundation. Blattmachr graduated from Columbia University School of Law cum laude, where he was recognized as a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar, and received his AB degree from Bucknell University, majoring in mathematics.

SAMUEL A. DONALDSON, JD, LL.M., AEP® (DISTINGUISHED)

Samuel A. Donaldson is a professor of law at Georgia State University in Atlanta, Georgia. Prior to joining the Georgia State faculty in 2012, he was on the faculty at the University of Washington School of Law for 13 years. During his tenure at the University of Washington, he was a five-time recipient of the Philip A. Trautman Professor of the Year award from the school of law's Student Bar Association, most recently in 2011. Donaldson served for two years as issociate dean for academic administration and for six years as the director of the law school's graduate program associate dean for academic administration and for six years as the director of the law school's graduate program in taxation. He teaches a number of tax and estate planning courses, as well as courses in the areas of property, commercial law, and professional responsibility. Donaldson is an academic fellow of ACTEC and a member of the Bar in Washington, Oregon, and Arizona. Among his scholarly works, he is a co-author of the West casebook, Federal Income Tax. A Contemporary Approach, and a co-author of the Price on Contemporary Estate Planning treatise published by CCH. Donaldson has served as the Harry R. Horrow Visiting Professor of International Law at Northwestern University and a visiting assistant professor at the University of Florida Levin College of Law. Jerome M. Hesch is Of Counsel to Berger Singerman in Miami, Florida. He is the director of the Notre Dame Tax and
Estate Planning Institute, on the Tax Management advisory board, a fellow of ACTEC, has published numerous articles,
tax management portfolios, and co-authored a law school casebook on Federal Income Taxation, now in its fourth edition. He has presented papers for the Heckerling Institute on Estate Planning, the University of Southern California Tax Institute, the Southern Federal Tax Conference, and the New York University Institute on Federal Taxation, among others. He participated in several bar association projects, including the drafting committee for the Florida Revised Uniform Partnership Act and preparing the ABA's comments on the IRS's proposed private annuity regulations. He received his BA and MBA from the University of Michigan and a JD from the University of Buffalo Law School. He was with the Office of Chief Counsel, Internal Revenue Service, in Washington, DC from 1970 to 1975, and was a full-time law professor from 1975 to 1994, teaching at the University of Miami School of Law, Albany Law School, and Union University. He is currently an adjunct professor of law, teaching courses at Florida International University Law School, the graduate program in estate planning at University of Miami and the online LL.M. program at Boston iversity School of Law. Having grown up in Buffalo, he remains a Buffalo Bills fan.

STANLEY M. JOHANSON, JD, LL.M., AEP® (DISTINGUISHED)
Professor Johanson has been on the faculty of the University of Texas School of Law since 1963, currently teaching courses on wills & estates and properly law. He is the University Distinguished Teaching Professor and holds the James A. Elkins Centennial Chair in Law. Professor Johanson has also taught as a visiting professor at several other law schools, including Florida State, Georgetown, Indiana, North Carolina, Utah, the University of Washington, UCLA, and the University of Chicago. Johanson has received many awards and honors, including: the University of Texas Teaching Excellence Award on eleven occasions (most recently in 2011 when he received the Texas Exes Teaching Award); named Faculty Member of the Year, for the third time in four years, by the law school's Student Bar Association; one of twelve faculty members elected to the inaugural class of the University of Texas Academy of Distinguished Teachers in 1995; the Treat Award for Excellence presented by the National College of Probate Judges in 1997; a Lifetime Achievement Award for his contributions to Texas Probate and Trust Law by the real estate, probate and Literime Achievement Award for his Continuonis to lease Probate and Trost Law by the feat estate, produce and trust law section of the State Bar of Texas in 2005; recipient of the endowed Massey Teaching Excellence Award at the law school in 2006; the Outstanding Tax Lawyer award, presented by the taxation section of the State Bar of Texas in 2011; and in 2008, a group of students from the 1960s announced the establishment of the Stanley Johanson Chair for Teaching Excellence. Johanson has given BAR/BRI bar review lectures to students preparing for the bar examination in a number of states. His publications include: Johanson's Texas Estates Code Annotated (2014 - published annually since 1995); Gilbert's Law Summary on Wills (2010); Wills, Trusts & Estates, a law school casebook adopted at over 120 American law schools, (9th ed. 2013) (editor emeritus).
