Jay Adkisson is an attorney who practices in the areas of creditor-debtor litigation, asset protection and wealth preservation, and captive insurance companies and insurance/reinsurance litigation. Jay has acted as an expert witness in various areas, and occasionally as a court-appointed receiver.
