Best Idea Corner •

Integrating Your Council with NAEPC

Membership in NAEPC offers valuable benefits for both the council and its members and the council must take an active role to ensure that they are fully-utilized. Here are some best practices with regard to creating the connection between your council's members, board of directors, and the national organization.

- Share information about the affiliation with members verbally, in print, and via email and explain that your EPC is a member, highlighting the valuable <u>benefits</u> and discounts. Incorporate this message as a regular part of the announcements at each membership meeting.
- Enroll members in the "Every Council Campaign" and supply a member roster to NAEPC. Without this participation, your council's members won't get the piece of the puzzle that makes the connection from NAEPC to your council.
- Empower the council's staff executive to become a leader in the Council / NAEPC relationship.
- Create a "Liaison" position on the council's board and charge this person with presenting updates
 from the national office information on initiatives, sharing NAEPC requests, etc. These reports
 should be brief, but add tremendous value. (Don't forget to Let NAEPC know who you have assigned
 to this position!)
- Plan and budget to send at least one council officer and the staff executive to the Annual Conference
 to participate in <u>Council Leadership Day</u> and to a <u>Regional Leadership Day</u> conference every year.
 These events are the best place to hear what other councils are doing, how they are doing it, and to
 get ideas for membership growth and retention, new programs, and exciting initiatives.
